

Thank you for choosing THE DO RE MI GOSPEL MUSIC ACADEMY, INC. for your gospel music education and fun. The Academy is devoted to helping the church by strengthening and improving music for the honor and glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Students will be blessed with gospel music education by exploring and improving their God-given talents and will enjoy singing activities, both individual and group, along with special concerts, Christian fellowship, and recreation. Classes are offered from beginner through advanced songwriting. This year's sessions will be held June 2-14, 2024.

New this year will be the Special Adult Night Class meeting 6-8 PM, Tuesday and Thursday nights of both weeks. Academy week will again be week 1, (June 1-6) (ages 8 and above). SHAPE week will be week 2, June 8-13 (ages 13 and above only.) The Songbird (half day class for age 3-7ish) and Momma Bird class will be offered week 2, June 9-13 ONLY. We anticipate being at full capacity again this year, with a waiting list. Register early to save your spot. Fees are not due until June 2025. The Academy will close at 3:30 p.m. after final performance singing on Friday, June 13. There will be no dormitory accommodations available on Friday night, June 13. There will be no supper meal served on Friday. The final meal provided will be lunch on Friday. All Students should be picked up before 5 pm on Friday, June 13, 2025.

DORMITORY AND RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

The goal of our on-campus dormitory and residential program is to ensure the safety and welfare of each student. The residential program support staff will help the student make new friends and foster old friendships They will provide supervision and support services to assure a safe, enjoyable time at the Academy.

On-campus dormitory students <u>MUST BE 8 YEARS OF AGE</u> or older, with the ability to take care of their basic needs (showering, hair grooming, teeth brushing, etc.). Our dorm staff will always be there to help if needed. Separate male and female dorms serve the students and staff. The dormitories are bunk bed style. The student will need to furnish linens, pillow, blankets, personal items, including bath towels, hand towels, washcloths, etc. Some students find it helpful to have a roll of paper towels also. Please refer to the items listed in the 'To Bring' section of this Family Information packet. Some dorm rooms are designed to share a full bathroom, including shower, commode, and lavatory, with the adjoining room. A community shower and restroom in each dormitory serves the general population.

Students are required to keep a clean and neat dorm room.

All younger dormitory students, ages 8-12, will be in the dorm at 9:00 PM with lights out at 9:30. All older dormitory students, ages 13+, will be in the dorm at 10 PM with lights out at 10:30 PM.

REGISTRATION & CHECK-IN

TIDBITS OF IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- On-campus students for week 1 check into the dorm Sunday, June 1, 2025, between 2-4 PM.
- On-campus students for week 2 check into the dorm Sunday, June 8, 2025, between 2-4 PM. Any week 2 students attending the singing June 7, may check into the dorms one (1) hour after the singing ends.
- Returning students be sure to bring your songbook from 2024, *Favorite Gospel Songs 3rd Edition*, and your piano lab book.
- A limited number of RV spots are on campus for families wishing to camp during the week.
 Call or text (615-969-2708) about reserving these, as they have been completely full every year.
- The Academy continues to offer a virtual option. This is available year-round. Virtual and in person piano lessons are also offered year-round.
- Upon arrival, follow the parking signs (and the orange arrows on the map at the end of this packet), and **park in the grass**. Report directly to the office to check. Staff will NOT be available to check in students earlier than 2 P.M. See the map at the end of this packet.
- NO PARKING IN FRONT OF THE OFFICE.
- Please bring your luggage, personal items, and any remaining fees that you owe. See the list of items to bring later in this booklet.
- After registration, report to your dorm for room assignment. Staff will be available to assist with check-in and your luggage.
- Roommates are assigned by age, according to space availability. Students may request a roommate in their age group; however, the ACADEMY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MAKE FINAL BED ASSIGNMENTS.
- After dinner each Sunday, students will assemble in the Lodge for introductions, orientation, and a 'meet and greet.'
- Dorm meetings will be held by the dorm supervisors and staff after assembly.
- SONGBIRD classes are offered June 10-, 2025. As space is limited, parents are encouraged to pre-register for these classes. Both Songbirds and Sparrows will ATTEND FOR A HALF DAY ONLY. STUDENTS MUST BE PICKED UP AT NOON. CHILD CARE IS NOT PROVIDED BY THE ACADEMY.

DORMITORY CHECKOUT AND CLOSING PERFORMANCE

DORM CHECK OUT TIME: Week 1 - Saturday, June 7, between 10-11 AM.

Parents, please plan to pick up your child **before 11 a.m**. at the Academy. Dorm staff will be available for assistance.

Students attending both weeks do not need to check out on June 7.

DORM CHECK OUT TIME: Week 2 - Friday, June 13, between 3-5 PM.

The Academy will close after final performance singing on Friday, June 13, 2025. No dormitory accommodation is available for Friday, June 13. No supper meal will be provided on Friday, June 13, 2025. All students should be picked up no later than 5 P.M.

ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO CLEAN THEIR DORM ROOM **PRIOR** TO CHECK-OUT. PLEASE, DO NOT LEAVE CLOTHES OR OTHER ITEMS.

DO RE MI SONGBIRDS, SPARROWS, MAMA AND PAPA BIRD

This class will be offered June 9-13, 2025.

Childcare services are not provided by the Academy; therefore, all Songbirds & Sparrows must be picked up by noon. Under no circumstances will these students be allowed to remain on campus unsupervised.

One parent of each Songbird or Sparrow may register for a FREE class. This free class will end at noon to enable you to pick up your child. Any parent wanting to attend a more advanced class may test into that class and attend free until noon each day.

DAILY SCHEDULE

- We will strive to follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit each day.
- There is class time, free time, singing time every day, with a lot of FUN time.

IMPORTANT DAILY & WEEKLY DO RE MI HAPPENINGS

- Devotional services will be held each morning and evening session. BRING YOUR BIBLE.
- Night commuter classes do not include meals. The day commuter class includes lunch. Other meals may be purchased.
- The Veterans-Attend-Free-Program includes lunch only. Other meals may be purchased.
- Full Meal plans for commuters are available for purchase either at registration or paid daily.
- The big shaving cream fight will be held during Week 1. If you plan to participate, bring two cans of non-menthol shaving cream.

COMMUTER CLASS

A commuter program is available for those students who wish to drive in daily for the day or the night classes. This class is FREE for our Veterans. Lunch is included in the day commuter fee. Breakfast and dinner are NOT included in the registration fee, but may be purchased for the week or daily.

All students who commute must check in upon arrival on campus. Likewise, check-out is required when the student leaves campus. The check in/out location, staffed by a dorm staff person, is located at the Lodge corner of the Boys Dorm (see map).

A complete and detailed medication list must be presented to Dorm staff/ medical personnel, upon registration. All medication will be held by authorized staff and maintained in a secure location. Please bring medications in a sealed plastic bag with your child's name on it.

PRIVATE LESSONS

Everyone registered for class is eligible to register for private lessons. Private instruction is offered both weeks in piano, voice, guitar, bass, and fiddle. Private piano lessons are available year-round, no matter where you live. Our instructor uses the internet or simply by phone to continue to teach year-round. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- What is SHAPE week? It is for students age 13 and older and be held June 8-13, 2025. All levels of instruction are offered, but the classes move a little faster and are geared toward the older students. There is an ear training and songwriting class for all students during SHAPE week.
- What is the virtual class? This is an online class for all levels (excluding songbirds). It includes classroom instruction, a sectional class, and an assembly. This class is now offered yearround.
- Is my child a Songbird, Sparrow or day commuter? Songbirds and Sparrows are all half-day classes. Groups are divided by age once all registration is complete. Be sure to pre-register as these classes have been completely full each year. If your child is mature enough to engage in classroom activities for an entire school day, they are welcome to register for the Day Commuter class starting at age 7.
- If my child is a Songbird or Sparrow can I attend class? Yes. We offer a special Beginner Adult class, which parents can attend free. Parents will also be allowed to attend the advanced classes in the morning.
- Can I change class? Yes. We want you to get the most from this experience. If you would like to change from Commuter to On Campus, please let us know. Also, if you need to move up or down, let us know. We will make the change. We encourage students to let us know if they need to be in a different class.
- Will there be classes Saturday, June 7? We will prepare for the Annual Tribute Singing. Those staying one week only must be out of their dorm room by 11 AM; students staying both weeks do NOT need to check out between weeks and will be expected to attend the Annual Tribute Singing, Saturday, June 7.
- What if I have special dietary restrictions? We will attempt to make accommodation for your needs, if possible. If special food is required, please bring your food in labeled plastic bags. Our kitchen staff will store the food and heat it up for mealtime. While we cannot meet every request, we do try to work with each family. Please contact us before registration day to discuss special requirements.
- What is the Do Re Mi Museum? Part of our mission is to preserve the heritage of the shape notes. A museum has been established and is currently located in the Do Re Mi Office

building. Students are encouraged to visit. It is open daily during both weeks of the Academy and by appointment at other times. If you would like more information or would like to help in the development of this project, please email us. An old school building has been donated and moved to the Do Re Mi campus to house the museum. The Kelley McClard Fund has been established to fund the move and complete renovation of the building into the museum.

- What is the House system? Every student is placed in one of four Houses: Stamps, Speer, Gaither, or Vaughan. They work together daily to encourage each other and earn points toward the Memorial Trophy, which is presented to the House with the most points at the end of the week.
- Can my friends come? Yes, Monday is Friend Day, so your friends can come at no charge to see what we do. If they decide to attend, they can register that day and attend the Academy.
- What if my child needs to leave? Every year we have students who need to leave campus during the week. A parent must sign a student out and back in, any time they leave and return to campus.
- What if my child takes medicine? At registration, complete the medicine form, and the dorm staff will keep the medication locked up. They will also assist each child in taking their medicine at the correct times. Please send medication in a sealed plastic bag with your child's name on it.
- What is "Shout Out time?" Each day before lunch, students are given the opportunity to give a shout out to someone or something that was good that day. It is a special fun and encouraging time.
- What is the shaving cream fight? It is exactly like it sounds. All who wish to participate gather
 in a designated area and cover each other with shaving cream. It started as a way to keep
 the students from messing up the dorms and has become an annual tradition. You may wish
 to bring a swimsuit for this activity.
